Rhode Island College Local 1563 Continues Negotiations

Happy Spring! We want to update you all on some news and initiatives we are working on this spring. The Adjunct Union is in its sixth month of contract negotiations. The main issues we are focusing on are those we feel are most important to most adjuncts: pay increases, health care benefits, better working conditions (more time for personal leave, tuition-free courses for adjuncts, and other such issues). We hope to be done with negotiations by the end of the summer and will keep our membership updated as the new contract gets ironed out.

Did You Know?

Adjuncts have sick days: According to our contract, adjuncts in the bargaining unit are allowed up to 7% of the semester's class time for paid sick leave (about 2 classes if your class meets 30 times a semester).

Important dates so you can plan ahead:

May 1: You should receive your tentative fall schedule by this date
May 1: May Day Lunch for current/prospective department representatives to the Adjunct Union
October 1: Adjunct seniority list disbursed to department chairs
October 20: Tentative list of available courses for next SPRING semester circulated to adjuncts
November 15: Advancement Application for SPRING semester due
December 1: Tentative next SPRING course assignments sent to adjuncts in writing
December 14: Adjuncts sign, date, and return SPRING list to dept. chair
Mid– December: Adjunct courses assigned for next SPRING semester


Richard Walton Fundraiser
